# Chennai's Anupama brings silver laurels in snooker

## Hails Govt, TNBSA for sustained support

Chennai, Aug 27: Giving yet another proof of her rising stature, promising Tamil Nadu cueist Anupama Ramachandran has won the silver medal in the Under-21 World Snooker Championship held at Bucharest in Romania.

After a fine performance in the earlier stages, Anupama, a trainee of the S.A. Saleem Snooker Academy in the city, lost to Thailand's Panchaya Channoi 1-4 in the summit clash, ensuring a silver medal for India.

It turned out to be a double podium finish for India as another upcoming talent Keerthana Pandian won the bronze in the same section in the event organised by the IBSF.

Anupama, who had earlier won the Under-16 World title in 2017 and Bronze medal in U 16 World Snooker Championship in 2018, was accorded a rousing reception on her arrival at the airport here today.

Anupama, who have been practicing hard with multiple time Tamil Nadu Champion and former India No.3 S.A.Saleem at the SSA, is also eligible to represent India in the Women's-6 Red World Championship to be held in Malaysia in October and the Women's-15 Red Snooker Championship at Turkey in November this year.

She has been currently ranked Number one in India after the Selection camp held in Bangalore in June.

By winning the Silver at Bucharest, Anupama earned the distinction of becoming the first cueist from Tamil Nadu to win a medal in the World event.

Talking to reporters, Anupama, who has eight National junior titles to her credit, said she was happy to win the silver as the competition was challenging.



She said she had to face strong Thailand cueists both in the semifinal and in the final. "I gave my best in the summit clash, but Panchaya Channoi played very well and won the gold," she explained.

She said "though the Central and State governments are helping in promoting the green baize game, we need more support, so that many youngsters like me will take to the sport and bring laurels for the country".

While stressing the need that sponsors should come forward and support the sport, Anupama also suggested that snooker should be introduced as a sport as part of school and college curriculum, which will lead to unearthing more talents.

The Tamil Nadu Government supporting sportspersons winning laurels in National and International events by presenting cash awards

was encouraging and would encourage more youngsters to develop a career in sports, Anupama said.

Speaking about Anupama's silver medal winning performance, Saleem, who was also present at the airport, said it was yet another proof of her rising stature.

"Anupama is made of sterner stuff and I expect her to win many more laurels in future," he added.

## Serena begins last hurrah at US Open; faces Danka first

New York, Aug 27: In what is set to be her final tournament, 23-time major champion America's Serena Williams will face Montenegro's Danka Kovinic in the women's singles opening round of the US Open, season's final Grand Slam tournament, starting from August 29.

Earlier this month, Williams announced her impending retirement after the US Open. A six-time US Open champion will face world No.80 Kovinic for the first time.

The 27-year-old Montenegrin reached a career-high ranking of No.46 in 2016 and became the first woman from her country to win a WTA Tour title last year at Charleston.

In January, Kovinic broke new

ground for Montenegro at the Australian Open after defeating Emma Raducanu to become the first woman from her country to reach the third round of a Slam.

The winner of that opener will face either No.2 Anett Kontaveit or Romania's Jaqueline Cristian.

World No.1 Iga Swiatek of Poland topped the draw and will face Italy's Jasmine Paolini in the first round. The winner will face either 2018 champion Sloane Stephens of America or Belgium's Greet Minnen.

Also drawn into Swiatek's top quarter are three former major champions in No.9 seed Garbine Muguruza (Spain), Jelena Ostapenko (Latvia) and Petra Kvitova (Croatia), as well as the highest-seeded American, No.8 Jessica Pegula.

No.24 seed Amanda Anisimova and two-time quarterfinalist Elise Mertens (Belgium) also landed in Swiatek's quarter.

Another Latvian Jelena Ostapenko faces a tough opening draw against 19-year-old Chinese talent Zheng Qinwen.

The no.4 seed Spanish Paula Badosa leads the second quarter of the draw and will take on Lesia Tsurenko of Ukraine in the first round.

Reigning champion Emma Raducanu has been drawn into Badosa's quarter and will open against France's Alize Cornet. The Frenchwoman is set to play her 63rd consecutive Slam, which will break the record for most consecutive Slam main-draw appearances by a WTA player.
